Dependent Resurvey, South Boundary, T. 24 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

from which

A hemlock, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 12° W., 42 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 BT. (1951 bearing tree.)

A cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears S. $33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 79 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S4 BT. (1963 bearing tree.)

Ascend 193 ft. over SE. slope.

44.02 Base of bluff, 180 ft. high, bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E. for 120 lks. dist. to a crevice that bears N. 70° W.

45.42 Top of bluff; desc. 25 ft. over SW. slope.

46.58 Crevice, course S. 70° E.; asc. 595 ft. over SE. slope.

64.60 Ridge, bears N. and S. 10° W.; desc. 367 ft. over W. slope.

64.80 Trail, bears N. and S. 10° W.

75.62 The cor. of secs. 32 and 33, determined from the original bearing trees:

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 65° E., 36 lks. dist., with old bark blaze, breast high, and partial scribe marks. I reblaze and remark T24S R2W S33 BT. (1951) (Record distance, 25 lks.)

A yew, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 48 lks. dist., with scribe marks S5 BT visible. I reblaze and remark T25S R2W S5 BT. (1963) (Record bearing, S. 15° E., 50 lks. dist.)

A fir snag, 37 ins. diam., bears S. 40° W., 75 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks in old bark blaze.

A yew, 20 ins. diam., bears N. $26\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 25 lks. dist., with scribe marks S 2R visible. I reblaze and remark T24S R2W S32 BT. (1951) (Record bearing N. 40° W.)

This now becomes the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 70 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R2W S4 BT.
