	<p>From the cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33.</p> <p>N. 81° 28' W., bet. secs. 29 and 32.</p> <p>Ascend 349 ft. over E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
4.00	Edge of timber, bears S. and W., logged S. of line.
17.60	Slope changes from E. to N.; asc. 52 ft. along N. slope.
25.30	Top of ascent; desc. 46 ft. over NW. slope.
35.25	Foot of descent; asc. 29 ft. along N. slope.

This tree has been down approximately 2 years; the blaze is covered with 66 years of overgrowth. (Record bearing, N. 8° W.)</p> <p>A fir snag, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 11° E., 35 lks. dist., with scribe marks <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S BT. visible on old bark blaze.
