

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 24 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

Timber, fir, oak, madrone, cedar, ample, hemlock, and alder; undergrowth, young timber, hazel, arrowwood, ceanothus, salal, Oregon grape, blackberries, scotch broom, greasewood, huckleberry, vines, ferns, and weeds.

N. 0° 10' W., bet. secs. 8 and 9.

Descend 30 ft. over NE. slope, through medium timber and dense undergrowth.

- 1.00 Draw, drains N. 40° W.; asc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
 1.50 Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.
 4.30 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 100 ft. along broken W. slope.
 21.10 Spur ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 250 ft. over NE. slope; timber becomes scattering.
 28.80 Draw, drains N. 60° W.; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.
 33.50 Spur, slopes N. 15° W.; desc. 85 ft. over NE. slope.
 39.88 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 9, determined at record distance from the original bearing trees:

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N. $65\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 47 lks. dist., mkd. with old cruiser marks.

A hemlock, 25 ins. diam., bears N. $37\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 19 lks. dist., mkd. with an opened blaze. (Record bearing, N. $42\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees:

A yew, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $54\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 40 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S9 BT.

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. $71\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 83 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S8 BT.

The corner is 8 lks. W. of a creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 10° W.

N. 0° 04' E., beginning new measurement.

Descend 10 ft. over NE. slope, through scattering timber and moderate undergrowth.

- 0.30 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 10° W., bending to NW.; asc. 10 ft. along W. slope.
 4.50 Enter heavy timber, edge bears E. and W.
 15.10 Spur, slopes N. 40° W.; desc. 160 ft. over NE. slope.
 19.50 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.
