Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 24 S., R. 8 W.

34.40	Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 90 ft. over NE. slope.
37.65	Spur, slopes N. 15° W.; desc. 45 ft. over NW. slope.
38.91	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 33, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree:  A cedar, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 47° E., 29 lks. dist., mkd. with open face and old axe marks. Reblaze and mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S28 BT.  At the corner point  Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked  $\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 28}{S 33}$ T 24 S R 8 W 1962  from which a new bearing tree  A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 72 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 BT.  <hr/> S. 89° 29' W., beginning new measurement. Descend 90 ft. over NW. slope.
2.20	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 285 ft. over E. slope.
9.80	Spur ridge, bears N. and S., in saddle; desc. 420 ft. over SW. slope.
29.10	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 80° W.; desc. 25 ft. over NW. slope.
33.85	Creek, 6 lks. wide, course N. 10° E.; asc. 110 ft. over E. slope.
36.80	The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33.  Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay, loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, madrone, alder and chinquapin; undergrowth, young timber, salal, Oregon grape, rhododendron, huckleberry, arrowwood, vine maple, poison oak, hazel and fern.  <hr/> N. 3° 58' W., bet. secs. 28 and 29.  Ascend 140 ft. over broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.
13.85	Spur, slopes N. 45° E.; desc. 285 ft. over NW. slope, changing to N. slope.
20.55	Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 80° E.; asc. 260 ft. over a gentle S. slope.
22.00	Miner Creek Road, 15 lks. wide, bears E. and W.
39.61	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 29, determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:  A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 53° E., 26 lks. dist., mkd. with old axe marks, healed blaze, and crusier marks.
