

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 24 S., R. 8 W.

## CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rock, clay and sand.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, maple, alder, myrtle, and dogwood; undergrowth; young timber, huckleberry, salmonberry, arrowwood, vine maple and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28.

S.  $89^{\circ} 27'$  W., bet. secs. 21 and 28.

Descend 120 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

10.90 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S.  $40^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 180 ft. over NE. slope.

19.70 Spur ridge, bears N.  $40^{\circ}$  W. and S.  $40^{\circ}$  E.; desc. 200 ft. over SW. slope.

21.80 Miner Creek Road, 15 lks. wide, bears N.  $40^{\circ}$  W. and S.  $40^{\circ}$  E.

40.19 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 28, determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:

A stump hole, bears N.  $63^{\circ}$  W., 65 lks. dist.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.  $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 90 lks. dist., mkd. with a healed blaze and cruiser marks.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 21 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.  $72\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W., 44 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S21 BT.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S.  $6^{\circ}$  W., 69 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S28 BT.

S.  $86^{\circ} 37'$  W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 15 ft. over nearly level land.

2.30 Spring, drains S.  $70^{\circ}$  W.; desc. 45 ft. over nearly level bench land.

15.80 West edge of bench land; desc. 280 ft. over W. slope.

27.70 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 200 ft. over E. slope, changing to S. slope.

37.88 The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29.
