

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, South Boundary, T. 24 S., R. 1 W.

## CHAINS

- 66.03 Head of branch, course SE.; asc. 661 ft. over SE. slope, changing to E. slope.
- 94.94 Point for the closing cor. of Tps. 25 S., Rs. 1 and 2 W., hereinafter described.  
Ascend 48 ft. over E. slope.
- 98.88 Spur, slopes N.  $40^{\circ}$  E.; desc. 68 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 108.91 The SW. cor. of T. 24 S., R. 1 W., monumented with a basalt stone, 16 x 10 x 6 ins., firmly set, marked with 6 grooves on the N., E., and S. faces with CC on the E. face, from which the original bearing trees:
- A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.  $66\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 67 lks. dist., blaze healed. (Record bearing, N.  $65^{\circ}$  E.)
- A chinquapin snag, 8 ins. diam., bears S.  $11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 20 lks. dist., scribe marks 25S R1W S6 visible. (Record bearing, S.  $12^{\circ}$  E.)
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 3 ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

- A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.  $17\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 41 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R1W S31 BT.
- Bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post.
- Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, sugar pine, yew, madrone, chinquapin, and dogwood; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, huckleberry, and Oregon grape.
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- Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the West Boundary  
of T. 24 S., R. 1 W.  
(Restoring the 1896 survey by Carl S. Nicklin)
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- From the SW. cor. of T. 24 S., R. 1 W.  
N.  $7^{\circ}$  23' E., along the W. bdy. of sec. 31, marking and blazing the true line.  
Descend 673 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 9.61 Ravine, course N.  $30^{\circ}$  W.; slope changes to a W. slope.
- 16.10 Spur, slopes W., slope changes to NW. slope.
- 20.15 The cor. of Tps. 24 and 25 S., R. 2 W., described in the
