A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S. $48\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 60 lks. dist., marked S4 BT.A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 38° W., 54 lks. dist., marked TR37 S4 BT.

Descend 30 ft. over NE. slope.

43.00 Creek, 12 lks. wide, course S. 60° E.; asc. 320 ft. over S. slope, changing to broken W. slope.

55.75 The cor. of secs, 3, 4, 33, and 34, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 2 W., of this assignment.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, sugar pine, cedar, maple, yew, madrone, dogwood, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, huckleberry, Oregon grape, and rhododendron.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10.

S. $84^{\circ} 45'$ W., bet. secs. 4 and 9.

Ascend 615 ft. over E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

15.31 Spur. slopes S.; trail along top of spur bears N. and S. 15° E.; desc. 355 ft. over SW. slope.

29.85 Ascend 49 ft. over bench sloping S.

35.78 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 26 ft. over SW. slope.

36.91 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 9, monumented with a basalt stone, 12 x 10 x 6 ins., firmly set, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which the original bearing trees:A madrone, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 28 lks. dist., blaze healed. (Record: bears N. 33° E., 30 lks. dist.)A madrone, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 39° W., 30 lks. dist., blaze rotted, partial scribe marks visible. (Record bearing, S. 43° W.)
