

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 2 W.

## CHAINS

- 23.90 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 576 ft. over N. slope.
- 40.28 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, monumented with a basalt stone, 20 x 8 x 7 ins., firmly set, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face, from which the original bearing trees:
- A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears N.  $79\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 41 lks. dist., blaze rotted. (Record: bears N.  $68^{\circ}$  E., 40 lks. dist.)
- A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.  $50^{\circ} 45'$  W., 37 lks. dist., scribe marks  $\frac{1}{4}$  S BT visible. (Record bearing N.  $60^{\circ}$  W.)
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
- $$\begin{array}{c} \frac{1}{4} \\ S\ 6 \left| S\ 5 \\ 1951 \end{array}$$
- from which
- A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S.  $33\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 23 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S5 BT.
- Bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post.
- N.  $15^{\circ} 28'$  E., beginning new measurement.
- Descend 115 ft. over NE. slope.
- 4.15 Harrington Creek Road, graded dirt, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 65 ft. over NE. slope.
- 9.05 Branch, 4 lks. wide, course S.  $65^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 45 ft. over SE. slope.
- 11.80 Spur, slopes S.  $70^{\circ}$  E.; desc. 135 ft. over NE. slope.
- 16.90 Creek, 15 lks. wide, course SE. Line crosses about 10 lks. downstream from 40 ft. waterfall. Ascend 210 ft. over steep S. slope, changing to broken SE. slope.
- 27.40 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course S.  $30^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 65 ft. over broken SE. slope.
- 34.70 Spur, slopes S.  $50^{\circ}$  E.; desc. slightly along E. slope.
- 38.70 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course S.  $25^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 80 ft. over S. slope.
- 41.16 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 24 S., R. 2 W., of this assignment.
- Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, sugar pine, cedar, maple, yew, madrone, dogwood, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, huckleberry, Oregon grape, and rhododendron.
