Survey of Tract No. 37 in Section 4, T. 25 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

From the SE. cor. of Tract No. 37, on the line bet. secs. 3 and 4.

S. $89^{\circ} 20'$ W., on the S. bdy. of Tract No. 37, marking and blazing the true line.

Ascend 31 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.15 Point of a spur, slopes N.; desc. 31 ft. over NW. slope.

3.05 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 12 ft. along broken N. slope.

6.25 Creek, 15 lks. wide, course N. 35° E.; asc. 38 ft. along broken S. slope.

12.20 Same creek, 20 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 156 ft. over broken NE. slope.

18.06 Point for the SW. cor. of Tract No. 37.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land resurveyed in this township is extremely mountainous, with elevations ranging from 1,200 feet to 4,100 feet above mean sea level. The lowest elevation is found where Rock Creek crosses the line between Sections 2 and 11. The highest elevation occurs on the west boundary of Section 6. The soil is of a disintegrated lava mixed with clay, generally rocky with numerous bluffs. Timber consists largely of Douglas fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, and yew, maple, chinquapin, and dogwood are scattering over the area. The dense undergrowth includes vine maple, salal, huckleberry, Oregon grape, rhododendron, manzanita, and poison oak.
