

Subdivision of Section 21, T. 26 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 14° W., 649 lks. dist., mkd. C $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT.

A white oak, 22 ins. diam., bears N. $72\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 252 lks. dist., mkd. C $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT.

From this point, a local center $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 21, established by M. B. Germond, in 1908, bears S. $24^{\circ} 00'$ E., 0.70 chs. dist., at the corner of two fences. A barbed wire fence extends W., and a woven and barbed wire fence extends N. Point determined at record distance from Germond's bearing trees:

A rotted fir stump bears S. $37\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 459 lks. dist.

An oak stump shell bears S. $31\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 590 lks. dist.

A white oak, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 61° W., 303 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

Descend 104 ft. over NW. slope.

46.20 Leave open field, edge bears N. 35° E. and S. 35° W.; enter heavy timber and light undergrowth.

53.50 Woven and barbed wire fence bears N. 1° W. and S. 1° E.

55.94 Woven and barbed wire fence bears E. and W.

58.60 Spur, slopes N. 30° W.; desc. 1 ft. over NE. slope.

60.12 From this point a local corner bears West, 0.01 chs. dist., established by M. B. Germond, in 1908, monumented with a healed blaze on the NE. root of a sawed fir stump, 40 ins. diam., from which the remains of Germond's bearing trees:

A maple, 40 ins. diam., bears S. $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 22 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A burned fir stump, 20 ins. diam., bears N. $38\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 34 lks. dist.

Corner is located at intersection of fences extending S. and W.

Descend 106 ft. over NE. slope across old logged area through scattering timber and light undergrowth.

71.90 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 55° W.; asc. 131 ft. over SW. slope.

78.40 Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 1 ft. over NW. slope.

80.26 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 16 and 21.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22.

N. $89^{\circ} 33'$ W., on the E. and W. center line of sec. 21.

Ascend 157 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

9.10 Ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 382 ft. over steep W. slope.
