CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 25 is located in mountainous terrain approximately three miles northeast of the village of Nonpareil, Oregon, in Douglas County. The soil is rocky clay loam, best suited for the raising of timber. The section is covered with medium to heavy stands of fir; cedar, madrone, hemlock, oak, dogwood, ash, yew, and alder. Undergrowth is scattering to dense, including young timber, hazel, ceanothus, arrowwood, manzanita, live oak, huckleberry, salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, vines, ferns, weeds, and native grasses. Most of the privately owned lands have been logged. The southern part of the section is drained by Cantell Creek, which flows southwesterly to Calapooya Creek. The east side of the section is drained by Jeffers Creek which drains southeasterly to Calapooya Creek. The northern portion of the section drains northerly through Oldham Creek. The water supply is ample. No mineral deposits were noted and no mining is carried on. There are no settlers in this section. Some cattle were noted, grazing over the area resurveyed.

The mean magnetic declination, determined by numerous readings over the area resurveyed, is $19^{\circ} 49'$ E., with a range of 45° due to local attraction.
