

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

## Dependent Resurvey, West Boundary, T. 23 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

- 6.24 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 60° W.; asc. 361 ft. over SE. slope, changing to S. slope.
- 31.32 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 213 ft. over NW. slope.
- 32.27 Road, unimproved, 15 lks. wide, bears E. and W.
- 34.05 Enter heavy timber, edge bears E. and W.
- 38.82 The cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, protruding 12 ins. above the ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous, steep slopes.  
Soil, sandy loam, sandstone outcrops.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, and cedar; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, alder, blackberry, and madrone.

## Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 6 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

(Restoring the 1883 survey by John A. McQuinn, and correcting the 1957 dependent resurvey by Eggen)

From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 11° 12' E., bet. secs. 31 and 32, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend 278 ft. over N. slope.

- 6.30 Gully, drains E.; asc. 88 ft. over S. slope.
- 9.80 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 339 ft. over N. slope.
- 10.70 Gully, drains E.; asc. 275 ft. over S. slope.
- 17.60 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 420 ft. over N. slope.
- 26.20 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 378 ft. over S. slope.
- 37.08 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 123 ft. over N. slope.
- 40.08 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

From this point, the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, erroneously reestablished by Eggen, in 1957, bears West, 0.08 chs. dist., set, marked, and witnessed as described in the official record. I remove the iron post, and at the above corner point

Reset the iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked
