23.97	Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 63 ft. over N. slope.
30.88	Gully, drains W.; asc. 21 ft. over S. slope.
32.34	Head of ravine, drains W.; desc. 145 ft. over N. slope.
40.04	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. From this point, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30, erroneously reestablished by Eggen, in 1957, bears West, 0.08 chs. dist., set, marked, and witnessed as described in the official record. I remove the iron post, and at the corner point Reset the iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked T 23 S R 6 W S 30 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 29 1957 from which the bearing trees marked by Eggen, in 1957 A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 44° E., $59\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with a healed blaze. A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 80° W., $27\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with a healed blaze. Descend 105 ft. over N. slope.
42.64	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 291 ft. over S. slope.
56.40	Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 143 ft. over NW. slope.
75.77	Creek, 7 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 241 ft. over SE. slope.
80.08	The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, reestablished by Eggen, in 1957, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, protruding 12 ins. above the ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record. Land, mountainous. Soil, clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, and cedar; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, salal, and madrone.

4.03	Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 73 ft. along E. slope.

32.57	Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 265 ft. over NE. slope.
43.48	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
