Dependent Resurvey, Portion of S. Bdy., T. 21 S., R. 7 W.

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 21 lks.  
dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S32 BT.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 7° E., 41 lks.  
dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S5 BT.

Descend 228 ft. over broken SW. slope.

56.65 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 48 ft. over E.  
slope.

60.65 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 270 ft. over SW. slope.

78.02 Point for the corner of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, at pro-  
portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of  
the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.  $36\frac{3}{4}$ ° W.,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  lks.  
dist., mkd. T22S R7W S6 BT.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 5° W., 40 lks.  
dist., mkd. T21S R7W S31 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy, rocky, clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, madrone, and  
chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood,  
salmonberry, huckleberry, salal, poison oak, blackberry,  
ceanothus, and fern.

N. 89° 51' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Descend 122 ft. over SW. slope through heavy timber and  
dense undergrowth.

3.70 Little Paradise Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 10° W.;  
asc. 376 ft. over general E. slope.

22.50 Spur ridge, bears N. 15° W. and S. 15° E.; desc. 266 ft.  
over broken SW. slope.

diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground,
