Subdivision of Section 31, T. 28 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

The W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 30 and 31.

From the center N 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 31.

S. 89° 27' W., on the E. and W. center line of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 31.

Descend 30 ft. over SW. slope, along the N. edge of logged area, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S. 20° E.; asc. 195 ft. over SE. slope.

Spur, slopes S. 20° E.; desc. 45 ft. over SW. slope.

20.03

The NW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 31.

Descend 105 ft. over SW. slope, changing to W. slope, across logged area, through heavy young timber and dense undergrowth.

Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 35° E. and S. 35° W.

28.20

Ravine, drains S. 20° E.; asc. 75 ft. over SE. slope; leave logged area; enter heavy timber and dense undergrowth, edge bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E.

38.60

Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SW.; asc. 10 ft. along S. slope.

The N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 2 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1959 resurvey.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey of section 31 are situated about 4 miles north of the small town of Camas Valley, Oregon. Access is gained by way of Upper Camas Road, a paved and gravelled road which extends northerly from Camas Valley, through the southeastern portion of section 31.

The area is drained by the Middle Fork of the Coquille River and its tributaries. The main tributaries being Lake Creek, Cole Creek and Estes Creek, all of which flow in a southerly direction. The land is flat to gently rolling with elevations ranging from about 1,175 feet above sea level at the middle Fork of the Coquille River on the south boundary of section 31, to about 1,680 feet above sea level at the northwest corner of section 31.

Soil in the area is generally composed of rocky clay loam. There were 2 homes noted within the section and some farming is being done. The privately owned lands have been logged; the remainder of the section is covered with fine stands of timber consisting of fir, hemlock, cedar, white fir, madrone, alder, yew, maple, chinquapin, and oak. The undergrowth is primarily vine maple, hazel, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, ocean spray, fern, blackberry, huckleberry, rhododendron, and manzanita.
