	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The lands included in the foregoing survey are situated about 5 miles northwesterly of the town of Riddle, Oregon. Access is gained by way of Boomer Hill Road, a dirt and gravelled road which extends southwesterly from U. S. Highway No. 99, and by way of Doe Creek Road, a dirt and gravelled road which extends northeasterly from Glenbrook Loop Road.</p> <p>The area is drained by several small creeks which flow northwesterly into Thompson Creek, and by Doe Creek and its tributaries flowing southwesterly into Cow Creek. Elevations range from about 1,840 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 7, 12, 13, and 18, to about 2,880 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 7, 8, 17, and 18.</p>
