

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S. $88\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 32 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R8W S13 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. $67\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 71 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R8W S14 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 131 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R8W S11 BT.

From this point an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, 18 ins. above ground, bears N. $18^{\circ} 15'$ E., 1.22 chs. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay, loam.

Timber, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, chinquapin, yew and dogwood; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, live oak, poison oak, manzanita, vine maple, vines and ferns.

N. $0^{\circ} 09'$ E., bet. secs. 11 and 12.

Ascend 135 ft. over SW. slope, changing to S. slope, across old logged area.

6.15 Spur, slopes S. 10° W.; asc. 15 ft. along W. slope.

14.70 Top of ascent, slopes SW.; desc. 35 ft. over NW. slope.

18.50 Head of ravine, drains S. 75° W.; asc. 35 ft. over S. slope.

19.78 Point for the S $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 121 lks. dist., mkd. S $\frac{1}{16}$ S12 BT.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 66° W., 142 lks. dist., mkd. S $\frac{1}{16}$ S11 BT.

Ascend 235 ft. over S. slope.

21.15 Enter scattering timber, edge bears E. and W.

30.95 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 20 ft. over NE. slope.

35.55 Draw, drains E.; asc. 185 ft. over S. slope.

39.56 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12, determined at record distance from the original bearing trees:

A live oak, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 18 lks. dist., with visible scribe marks on opened blaze. (Record bearing, S. 82° E.)

A live oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 41° W., 16 lks. dist., with scribe mks. $\frac{1}{4}$ S on opened blaze. (Record bearing, N. 28° W.)
