38.80	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S.; asc. 10 ft. over SE. slope.
39.81	<p>The <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, recorded and re-monumented in 1962 by Howard W. Johnstone, Registered Land Surveyor No. 498, with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., 6 ins. above ground, firmly set, from which the original bearing trees:</p> <p>A pine, 20 ins. diam., bears N. <math>55\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}</math> W., 26 lks. dist., mkd. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S BT on opened double blaze. (Record bearing and distance, N. <math>60^{\circ}</math> W., 28 lks.)</p> <p>A pine, 35 ins. diam., bears S. <math>29\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}</math> E., 92 lks. dist., mkd. with a healed blaze. (Record bearing and distance, S. <math>32^{\circ}</math> E., 96 lks.)</p> <p>Johnstone apparently determined the corner point by a broken boundary method between the original bearing trees.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, <math>2\frac{1}{2}</math> ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T 31 S R 7 W <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 26 <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 35 1964</p> <p>from which new bearing trees</p> <p>A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. <math>66\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}</math> W., 68 lks. dist., mkd. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S26 BT.</p> <p>A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. <math>17\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}</math> W., 40 lks. dist., mkd. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S35 BT.</p> <p>Reset the iron pipe alongside the iron post.</p> <hr style="width: 20%; margin: 10px auto;"/> <p>S. <math>89^{\circ} 03'</math> W., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Ascend 60 ft. over SE. slope.</p>
8.60	Spur, slopes S.; desc. 75 ft. over SW. slope.
12.00	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S.; asc. 60 ft. over SE. slope.
15.30	Spur, slopes S.; desc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
18.90	Draw, drains. S.; asc. 210 ft. over SE. slope.
36.55	Spur, slopes S. $25^{\circ}$ W.; desc. 95 ft. over NW. slope.
40.03	<p>The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, pine, fir, hemlock, maple, madrona, alder, dogwood, yew, cedar, chinquapin, and live oak; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, arrowwood, huckleberry, manzanita, live oak, young timber, whitethorn, hazel, vines, and ferns.</p>
