CHAINS	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, pine, cedar, alder, hemlock, live oak, maple, madrone, chinquapin, and yew; undergrowth, young timber, manzanita, huckleberry, arrowwood, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, salal, vines, and ferns.
