79.30	Ravine, drains E.; asc. 30 ft. over SE. slope.
82.25	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 15 ft. over NE. slope.
83.49	<p>The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., protruding 6 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the dependent resurvey of a portion of the S. bdy. of T. 31 S., R. 7 W.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, yew, maple, hemlock, chinquapin, alder and dogwood; undergrowth, salal, gooseberry, huckleberry, live oak, poison oak, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, vine maple, young timber, ferns, and vines.</p>
28.30	<p>From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11. N. 89° 23' W., bet. secs. 3 and 10. Ascend 775 over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p> <p>Spur, slopes N. 40° E.; desc. 120 ft. over NW. slope.</p>
36.40	Ravine, drains N.; asc. 45 ft. over NE. slope.
38.60	<p>The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10, monumented with the remains of the original corner tree, a rotted fir stump, 18 ins. diam., mkd. ¼ S in negative on piece of overgrowth lying alongside the stump, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A rotted fir stump, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 76° E., 9 lks. dist., with no mks. remaining.
