S. 88° 17' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 155 ft. over NE. slope.

4.15 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 65 ft. over NW. slope.

7.05 Ravine, drains N.; asc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.

9.60 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 455 ft. over NW. slope.

24.25 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 10° E.; asc. 390 ft. over SE. slope.

33.85 Spur, slopes NE.; asc. 145 ft. over NE. slope.

39.58 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing trees:

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 25 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 70° E., 20 lks. dist., mkd. T 2S 7 BT on bark blaze.

A fir, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 54° W., 20 lks. dist., mkd. T32S R7W S9 BT on bark blaze.

A stump hole, bears N. 34° W., 26 lks. dist.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, yew, maple, hemlock, chinquapin, alder and dogwood; undergrowth, salal, gooseberry, huckleberry, Oregon grape, poison oak, live oak, hazel, arrowwood, vine maple, young timber, ferns, and vines.

N. 1° 44' W., bet. secs. 3 and 4.

Descend 470 ft. over NE. slope, changing to NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

11.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 30° E.; desc. 10 ft. along E. slope.

13.25 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.; asc. 170 ft. over SE. slope.

18.75 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 40 ft. over NE. slope.

20.55 Ravine, drains E.; asc. 285 ft. over SE. slope.
