

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 22 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS	
	Set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 5½ ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.  Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, and alder; undergrowth, arrowwood, hazel, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, salal, and fern.
	From the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26.  N. 88° 59' W., bet. secs. 23 and 26.  Descend 40 ft. over W. slope, through scattering timber and light undergrowth across old logged area.
1.80	Branch, 4 lks. wide, course N. 10° E.; asc. 120 ft. over E. slope.
10.25	Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
20.25	Ravine, drains N. 10° E.; asc. 65 ft. along broken N. slope.
32.65	Spur, slopes N. 15° E.; desc. 150 ft. over NW. slope.
37.80	Tractor trail, 12 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
39.50	Branch, 10 lks. wide, course N. 5° E.; asc. 25 ft. over E. slope.
40.095	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 26, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked  <div style="text-align: center;"> <math display="block">\frac{1}{4} \begin{array}{l} S 23 \\ S 26 \end{array}</math> T 22 S R 8 W 1964 </div> from which  A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 30 lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S23 BT.  A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 9° E., 100 lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S26 BT.  Ascend 110 ft. over E. slope.
44.15	Spur, slopes N. 10° E.; desc. 40 ft. over NW. slope.
45.30	Ravine, drains N.; asc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.
47.26	From this point, the SE. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 42, identical with the SW. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 41, bears North, 2.33 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by Ben B. Irving, County Surveyor, in 1945, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, from which the remaining original bearing tree,  A burned fir stump, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., 75 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.  and trees marked by Irving:
