Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 22 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 25° E., 47 lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S4 CS BT visible on unhealed blaze.

Add the marks B L M 1963 to brass cap.

N. 0° 28' E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 320 ft. over SW. slope.

12.90 Head of ravine, drains E.; asc. 440 ft. over S. slope.

28.40 Spur ridge, bears N. 50° W. and S. 50° E.; desc. 210 ft. over N. slope.

32.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE.; asc. slightly over SE. slope.

34.90 Point of spur, slopes E.; desc. 20 ft. over NE. slope.

36.80 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 70° E.; asc. 140 ft. over SE. slope.

40.40 True point for the closing corner of secs. 4 and 5, on the S. bdy. of sec. 32, T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. $21\frac{3}{4}$ ° E., 173 lks. dist., mkd. T22S R8W S4 CC BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. $47\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 89 lks. dist., mkd. T22S R8W S5 CC BT.

From this point, the original closing corner of secs. 4 and 5, bears N. 0° 28' E., 0.14 chs. dist., monumented with a fir, 32 ins. diam., with healed blazes on the S., E., and W. faces, from which the remaining original bearing tree,

A sawed fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears S. $18\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 79 lks. dist., with bottom part of healed blaze remaining. (Record bearing and distance, S. $16\frac{1}{4}$ ° E., 75 lks. dist.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Price in 1945,

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 53 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on opened blaze. (Record bearing and distance, S. $53\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 52 lks.)

From the same point the cor. of secs. 32 and 33, T. 21 S., R. 8 W., bears N. 89° 19' E., 13.90 chs. dist., heretofore described.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, alder, and madrone; undergrowth, fern, salal, poison oak, vine maple, and hazel.
