To Whom It May Concern:

On May 21, 1963, I pointed out to Cadastral Surveyor, James E. Jelley, the original southeast bearing tree of the corner of sections 20, 21, 28, and 29, Township 22 South, Range 8 West, W. M., Oregon. Said tree is a white oak, 30" in diameter. In 1933, under the direction of O. Thiel, I opened the blaze on this tree revealing the original scribe marks. I then witnessed the rescribing of this same tree by Thiel. This blaze is now decayed, and no marks remain. I have also seen in the past the original northwest bearing tree, with legible scribe marks, which no longer exists. I have had definite knowledge of these corner accessories for approximately 34 years.

To Whom It May Concern:

On May 17, 1963, I pointed out to Cadastral Surveyor, James E. Jelley, the original northeast bearing tree of the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 16 and 21, Township 22 South, Range 8 West, Willamette Meridian, Oregon. Said tree is a white oak, 34 inches in diameter. I have on numerous occasions seen ledgable scribe marks on an open blaze on this tree. This blaze is now decayed, and no marks remain. I have also seen in the past, ledgable scribe marks on the original southeast bearing tree which has since been destroyed by logging. I have had knowledge of these corner accessories for approximately 10 years.
