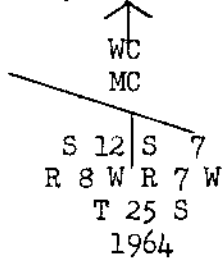


County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of E. Eddy., T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.



from which

A double myrtle, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 85° E., 82 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

A myrtle, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 74° W., $36\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

Descend 25 ft. over N. slope.

4.30 Point for the meander cor. of secs. 7 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. The cor. point falls on the left bank of the Umpqua River, course N. 70° W., where it is impracticable to establish a permanent monument.

Continue across river.

10.83 Point for the meander cor. of secs. 7 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. No permanent monument established.

10.90 Right bank of the Umpqua River; asc. 40 ft. over river bank and nearly level bottom land, through old orchard.

18.75 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, recorded and remonumented by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1961, with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, protruding 12 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mdk.

from which the original bearing trees

A sawed oak stump, 26 ins. diam., bears S. $32\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 370 lks. dist., with opened blaze, no marks visible. (Record, S. 31° E., 368 lks.)

An oak, 37 ins. diam., bears N. $8\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 810 lks. dist., dist., with scribe marks BT visible on opened blaze and scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S12 visible on partially healed blaze. This tree was remarked by Claude Kerr in 1954. (Record, N. $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.)

and a bearing tree marked by Godfrey

An oak, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 87° E., $387\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S7 CSBT visible on partially healed double blaze.

Add marks ELM 1964 to bottom of brass cap.
