	<p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set and iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T 25 S R 7 W $\frac{1}{4}$ S 20 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 29 1964</p> <p>from which a new bearing tree</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 23½ lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S20 BT.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Reset iron rod alongside the iron post.</p> <p>The cor. is located 1 lk. SW. of a fence cor., with fences extending N. and E.</p> <p>N. 89° 16' W., bet. secs. 20 and 29.</p> <p>Ascend 55 ft. over SE. slope, across pasture land, through scattering your timber and undergrowth.</p>
1.90	Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears N. 30° E. and S. 55° W.
6.00	Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 30 ft. over SW. slope.
8.40	Ravine, drains S. 5° E., asc. 195 ft. over broken SE. slope, also enter heavy young timber and dense undergrowth.
22.40	Spur, slopes S.; desc. 95 ft. over SW. slope.
27.00	Ravine, drains S. 20° W.; asc. 145 ft. over E. slope.
32.20	Spur, slopes S. 20° E.; desc. 115 ft. over SW. slope.
37.60	Ravine, drains S. 25° E.; asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.
39.17	<p>The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, white fir, madrone, alder, dogwood, yew, oak, and maple; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, ocean spray, hazel, Oregon grape, poison oak, manzanita, rhododendron, huckleberry, and blackberry.</p>
	<p>N. 85° 19' W., bet. secs. 19 and 30.</p> <p>Ascend 270 ft. over general E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
10.00	Spur, slopes SE.; desc. 200 ft. over SW. slope.
23.30	Ravine, drains S.; asc. 410 ft. over E. slope.
31.20	Spur, slopes S. 30° E.; desc. 180 ft. over SW. slope.
37.25	Dry creek bed, 3 lks. wide, drains S. 30° E.; asc. 185 ft. over steep E. slope.
39.18	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 30, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
