A fir snag, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 27° E., 12 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 26½° W., 47½ lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on opened blaze. Remarked by Byron, S19 T25S R7W CS BT. (Record, S. 29½° W., 76 lks.)

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 26° W., 9 lks. dist., with rotted blaze, no original marks visible. Remarked by Byron, with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

and bearing trees marked by Byron

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears East, 87 lks. dist., with a healed double blaze.

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 22° E., 38 lks. dist., with scribe marks T25S CS S20 BT visible on a partially healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 45° E., 57 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S17 BT.

Add marks BLM 1964 to bottom of brass cap.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, white fir, madrone, alder, dogwood, yew, oak, and maple; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, ocean spray, hazel, Oreg n grape, poison oak, manzanita, rhododendr n, huckleberry and blackberry.

N. 89° 59' W., bet. secs. 18 and 19.

Descend 315 ft. over broken NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

24.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.; asc. 40 ft. over NE. slope.

25.90 Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 20 ft. over W. slope.

26.70 Ravine, drains N. 15° W., asc. 55 ft. over NE. slope.

29.00 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 120 ft. over W. slope.

40.13 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19, determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 13° W., 27 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze, with scribe marks BT visible on bark blaze.

A down fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 59° W., 33 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.
