60.75	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 15° E.; asc. 460 ft. over N.E. slope.
70.70	Spur, slopes N. 25° W.; desc. 30 ft. over NW. slope.
72.60	Ravine, drains N. 15° W.; asc. 110 ft. over NE. slope.
80.58	The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, dogwood, chinquapin, yew, live oak and alder; undergrowth, poison oak, salal, arrowwood, Oregon grape, hazel, vine maple, huckleberry, rhododendron, vines & ferns.
	N. 0° 54' E., bet. secs. 23 and 24. Descend 385 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.
15.35	Creek, 1 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; asc. 45 ft. over SW. slope.
21.95	Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 155 ft. over W. slope, changing to N. slope.
39.45	Spur, slopes N. 20° W.; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.
42.55	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 24, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. 61.25	Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 185 ft. over NW. slope.
73.00	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 320 ft. over S. W. slope.
85.10	The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees: A down fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 25 lks. dist., no marks remaining on burned bark. A fir, 37 ins. diam., bears S. 80° E.; 40 lks. dist., with old axe marks on decaying bark
