

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 51.40 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 175 ft. over W. slope.
- 55.75 Ravine, drains N. 30° W.; asc. 40 ft. over N.E. slope.
- 57.75 Spur, slopes N. 30° W.; desc. 55 ft. over N.W. slope.
- 59.19 Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 14.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 49½° W., 8½ lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S11 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 40° E., 28 lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S14 BT.

Descend 160 ft. over N.W. slope.

- 65.75 Creek, 7 lks. wide, course N.E.; asc. 270 ft. over S.E. slope.

- 78.92 The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, madrone, chinquapin, alder, dogwood and yew; undergrowth, salal, hazel, vine maple, rhododendron, arrowwood, Oregon grape, huckleberry, poison oak, vines and ferns.

From the cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.

S. 85° 29' W., bet. secs. 15 and 22.

Descend 5 ft. over nearly level bottom land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 1.70 Creek, 20 lks. wide, course N. 65° E.; asc. 15 ft. along creek bottom.
- 10.80 Leave creek, course E., from S.W.; asc. 50 ft. over S.E. slope.
- 18.67 Point for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 22.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{E } 1/16 \quad \frac{\text{S } 15}{\text{S } 22} \\ 1965 \end{array}$$

from which

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 69¼° E., 80 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S15 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 54° W., 209 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S22 BT.

Ascend 85 ft. over S.E. slope.
