from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.  $40^\circ$  E., 46 lks. dist., mkd. 2 on opened blaze. (Record, 35 lks.)A cedar snag, 44 ins. diam., bears S.  $40^\circ$  W., 12 lks. dist., 9 lks. dist. to face, no marks remaining. (Record, 9 lks.)A stump hole, bears N.  $50^\circ$  W., 20 lks. dist.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Byron

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S.  $22\frac{3}{4}^\circ$  E., 10 lks. dist., mkd. S7 CS BT on double blaze.

Add the marks BLM to the brass cap.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, yew, dogwood, alder and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, hazel, poison oak, arrowwood, Oregon grape, young timber, ferns &amp; vines.

N.  $1^\circ 09'$  E., on the W. bdy. of sec. 6.

Descend 25 ft. over N.E. slope, along E. edge of logged area, through light undergrowth.

1.70 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.; asc. 95 ft. over S.W. slope.

5.75 Spur, slopes S.  $60^\circ$  E.; enter heavy timber, edge bears N. W. and S.; desc. 25 ft. over N.E. slope.8.15 Wet ravine, drains S.  $60^\circ$  E.; asc. 280 ft. over S.W. slope.16.64 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. d cor. of sec. 1 only, on the E. bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 4 W., at proportionate distance as based on the official plat.
