| | <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The portion of T. 29 S., R. 3 W., covered by this resurvey is located in Doug. Co., about 9 mj. east of the town of M. Creek, Ore. Elevations range from about 950 ft. to 2,500 ft. above sea level. The area is mountainous, suited mainly for timber growing, except along S. Myrtle Ck. which is good bottom land being farmed. Soil consists of rocky clay in the mountainous areas and clay loam along the bottom lands.</p> <p>The timber is predominately D. fir, with stands of pine, W. fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, madrone, alder, chinq., dogwood, yew & live oak. Undergrowth in the area consists of salal, poison oak, arrow-wood, hazel, rhododendron, Oregon grape, vine maple, blackberry, huckleberry, young timber, vines and ferns.</p> <p>The southern $\frac{1}{3}$ of the Tp. is drained by Days Ck. which flows in a SW. direction. The northern $\frac{2}{3}$ of the Twp. is drained by S. Myrtle Ck. & a number of small streams which flow in a SW. direction. Access to the area is gained by way of an asphalt road into the Tp. along S. Myrtle Creek. Also from Days Creek, Oregon, on an asphalt road along Days Creek. A number of logging roads branch out from these two main roads throughout the area. Several small farms and ranches are located along South Myrtle Creek.</p> <p>There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed.</p> <p>The average of a considerable number of readings over all the parts of the area resurveyed gives a value of $20^{\circ} 10'$ E., for mean magnetic declination. There is a range of $1^{\circ} 30'$ in local attraction.</p> |
