GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The lands included in the foregoing survey are situated in mountainous terrain about 5 miles southwesterly of the town of Riddle, Oregon. Access is by way of Glenbrook Loop Road, and by a road which extends from it along Council Creek.</p> <p>The area is drained by Council Creek, Squaw Creek, and Rattlesnake Creek, all of which flow northerly into Cow Creek. Elevations range from about 2,320 feet above sea level on the ridge between secs. 5 and 6, to about 800 ft. above sea level at Council Creek near the northeast corner of section 5.</p> <p>Soil is generally composed of rocky clay loam. Timber consists primarily of fir, with stands of cedar, madrone, maple, yew, pine, dogwood, alder, oak, & myrtle, The undergrowth includes vine maple, salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, hazel, fern, oceanspray, manzanita, huckleberry, and blackberry.</p> <p>Considerable evidence of abandoned mining operations were noted in the area resurveyed.</p> <p>The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the entire area gives a mean magnetic declination of 19°15' E. with a range of 1° 30' in local attraction.</p>
