	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, Douglas fir, and scattering of ponderosa pine and incense cedar; undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, chinquapin, madrone, arrowwood, manzanita, whitethorn, salal, poison oak, and ceanothus.
	From the center E 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 7.
	N. 0° 08' E. on the N. and S. center line of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 7.
	Ascend 10 ft. over SE. slope.
0.35	Spur ridge, bears N. 40° E. and SW.; desc. 225 ft. over NW. slope.
7.55	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 25° E.; asc. 60 ft. over SE slope.
12.45	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.
19.32	Point for the NE 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 7 at intersection with the E. and W. center line of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ .
	Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
