A white fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 53° W., 72 lks.
dist., marked T30S R7W S21 BT.

A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 27° W., 59 lks.
dist., marked T30S R7W S16 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, white fir, cedar, madrone, pine, yew, chinquapin,
live oak, oak, and hemlock; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel,
poison oak, Oregon grape, salal, manzanita, huckleberry,
blackberry, fern and ocean spray.
