An oak, 36 ins. diam., bears N. $60\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 688 lks.
dist., mkd. T23S R7W S9 BT.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 16° E., 21 lks.
dist., mkd. T23S R7W S16 BT.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 49 lks.
dist., mkd. T23S R7W S17 BT.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $53\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 141 lks.
dist., mkd. T23S R7W S8 BT.

Deposit remains of the oak post alongside iron post.
The corner falls at the S. edge of a dirt road, 20 lks.
wide, bearing NW. and SE.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, and madrone;
undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, hazel, arrowwood,
salmonberry, huckleberry, salal, Oregon grape, manzanita,
rhododendron, ceanothus, and fern.
