Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., $40\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S17 BT.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. $75\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 19 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S18 BT.

Corner falls on spur, slopes W.; desc. 35 ft. over NW. slope.

50.65 Bottom of descent, slopes W.; asc. 225 ft. over SW. slope.

63.85 Spur, slopes S. 65° W.; desc. 225 ft. over general N. slope.

77.10 Top of bluff, edge bears E. and W.; desc. 50 ft. over face.

77.62 The cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree:

A fir snag, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 56° W., 76 lks. dist., with scribe marks W T23S 18 BT visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. $40\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 36 lks. dist., with a healed double blaze.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 47° E., 137 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R7W S8 BT.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. $63\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 124 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R7W S17 BT.

An alder, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $12\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 118 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R7W S7 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, myrtle, and madrone;; undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, huckleberry, hazel, arrowwood, salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, Scotch-broom, blackberry, ceanothus, and fern.
