CHAINS	
	Descend 75 ft. over NE. slope, generally along the W. edge of logged area, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
2.65	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.; asc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
5.25	Spur, slopes W.; desc. 55 ft. over NW. slope.
7.85	Ravine, drains W.; asc. 145 ft. over SW. slope.
13.30	Spur, slopes N. 60° W.; desc. 245 ft. over N. slope.
18.50	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 65° W., enter logged area, edge bears generally S. and N. 65° W.; asc. 15 ft. over SW. slope.
19.78	Point for the S 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 8. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 19 ins. in the ground, to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd. S 1/16 S 7 S 8 1965 from which A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 17½° E., 52½ lks. dist., mkd. S1/16 S8 BT. A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 37° W., 128 lks. dist., mkd. S1/16 S7 BT. Ascend 5 ft. over SW. slope.
20.00	Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 15 ft. over NW. slope.
21.55	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 100 ft. over SW. slope.
27.00	Spur, slopes N. 70° W.; desc. 115 ft. over N. slope.
32.31	An original line tree marked by William M. Bushey, in 1894, a fir, 60 ins. diam., marked by 2 healed blazes on the S. side. Descend 55 ft. over N. slope.
33.90	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course W., asc. 35 ft. over SW. slope.
39.56	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 8, perpetuated and recorded by Robert M. Thompson, Registered Engineer, in 1956, monumented with a bent iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 6 ins. above ground, with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 20 ins. above ground, from which the original bearing trees; A white oak, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 57° E., 67 lks. dist., with opened blaze, no marks visible. (Record, 66 lks.) A white oak, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 11° W., 76 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 9° W.) and a bearing tree marked by George Wenderoth, Registered Land Surveyor, in 1951.
