GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are situated about 3 miles east of the hamlet of Days Creek, Oregon. Access is by way of a paved County Road which extends along Days Creek, and by a gravelled road which branches off from it.

The area is drained by Days Creek and by several small creeks which flow northerly into it. Elevations range from about 930 feet above sea level at Days Creek, to about 2,000 feet above sea level on the ridge between sections 7 and 18.

The soil is composed generally of rocky clay loam, with sandy clay loam in the bottom land along Days Creek, Timber is primarily fir, with stands of cedar, oak, alder, yew, madrone, chinquapin, and maple; the undergrowth includes vine maple, willow, poison oak, salal, oceanspray, salmonberry, huckleberry, blackberry, hazel and fern.

No evidence of mineral was noted in the area resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of observations made throughout the area give a mean magnetic declination of 19° 30' E., with a range of up to 1° 00' in local attraction.
