

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of Line Btwn. Secs. 3 & 10, T. 33 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 57° E., 45 lks. dist., marked T33S R5W S11 BT.

A cedar, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 72° W., 42 lks. dist., marked T33S R5W S3 BT.

N. 89° 37' W., bet. secs. 3 & 10, marking & blazing the true line.

Ascend 360 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

15.80 Ridge, the divide bet. the Umpqua River and the Rogue River, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 280 ft. over broken SW. slope.

40.00 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 3 & 10, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N.  $13\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 84 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S3 BT.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E., 98 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S10 BT.

Descend 275 ft. over broken SW. slope.

49.20 Draw, drains S.; asc. 110 ft. over broken SE. slope.

55.30 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 40 ft. over W. slope.

57.70 Draw, drains S.; asc. 150 ft. over SE. slope.

65.10 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 180 ft. over broken SW. slope.

76.15 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 110 ft. over SE. slope.

80.00 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 & 10, determined at record bearing and distance from each of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 68° E., 44 lks. dist., marked T33S R5W S3 BT on opened blaze.

A fallen sawed fir stump, 20 ins. diam., the stump hole of which bears S. 45° E., 4 lks. dist., with the scribe marks 33S S10 visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 34° W., 14 lks. dist., marked T33S 84 BT on partly healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground with brass cap marked
