

CHAINS

Remonumentation of Corner Points, T. 33 S., R. 4 W.

The cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19, and 24, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 8 ins., firmly set, 10 ins. in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, marked with 3 notches on N. and 3 on S. edges, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 16° E., 19 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record bearing, N. 20° E.)

A fir, 82 ins. diam., bears S. 32° E., 40 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 73½° W., 32 lks. dist., with scribe marks 3 S R5W S24 visible on partly healed blaze. Reblaze and mark T33S R5W S24 BT, below old blaze. (Record bearing, S. 72° W.)

A fir, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 54° W., 64 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record bearing and distance, N. 57° W., 63 lks.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked

Deposit the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 18, on the W. bdy. of the Twp., monumented with an unmarked basalt stone, 20 x 10 x 10 ins., firmly set, 10 ins. in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 50° E., 31 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S visible on partly healed blaze. Reblaze and mark ¼ S18 BT, below old blaze. (Record bearing and distance, S. 45½° E., 78 lks.)

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 50° W., 82 lks. dist., with healed blaze. Reblaze and mark ¼ S13 BT, below old blaze. (Record bearing and distance, N. 58° W., 27 lks. dist.)

Sharp apparently reversed the distances to these trees.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground, to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked
