Remonumentation of Corner Point, T. 33 S., R. 4 W.

A noble fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 23½° W., 34 lks. dist., marked T33S R4W S 7 BT.

Deposit the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 33 south, range 4 west, is located about 9 miles in a northeasterly direction from the hamlet of Sunny Valley, Oregon. The township is drained by Grave Creek and its tributaries, draining southerly to the Rogue River. The terrain is mountainous, with the elevation ranging from about 2,400 feet above sea level where the south boundary of the township crosses Grave Creek, to more than 5,200 feet above sea level on top of King Mountain on the west boundary of section 19.

The main access into the township is by way of a graveled road extending northeasterly from Sunny Valley through the township to Azalea which is about 8 miles northwesterly from the north boundary of section 4. Considerable logging has been done on the privately owned lands in the area, and a number of logging roads provide good access to most of the lands covered in the remonumentation.

Timber in the area consists of heavy stands of fir, pine, and cedar, and scattering hemlock, madrone, alder, chinquapin and yew; undergrowth consists of vine maple, ceanothus, arrowwood, poison oak, and rhododendron. There are several old mining claims in the township, most of which appear to be inactive.
