

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 28 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

A hemlock, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 76° E., 58 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R4W S13 CS BT. visible on partly healed double blaze.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 18½° W., 59 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R4W S14 CS BT visible on partly healed blaze.

A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 55° W., 15 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R4W S11 CS BT visible on partly healed double blaze.

Add marks ELM 1965 to brass Cap.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, white fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, yew, chinquapin, oak, maple, and dogwood; undergrowth, poison oak, ocean spray, vine maple, fern, Oregon grape, manzanita, salal, and hazel.

From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, on the E. bdy. of Township.

S. 89° 43' W., bet. secs. 12 and 13.

Descend 160 ft. over W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

8.15 Ravine, drains S.; asc. 195 ft. over S. E. slope.

16.50 Spur ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.; desc. 680 ft. over broken N.W. slope, along the S. edge of logged area, edges bear generally N.E. and W.

38.00 Creek, 4 lks. wide, from N. 75° E., course S. 50° W.; also enter logged area, edges bear generally S. and E.; asc. 20 ft. over S.E. slope.

39.18 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 12 and 13, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1961, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 16 ins. above the ground, with brass cap marked.

A hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 80° W., 25 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S visible on open blaze. (Record, a fir, 20 lks.)

The burned shell of a fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 18° W., 22 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Record, 17 lks.)

A down yew, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 82½° W., 31 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S12 CS BT visible on partly healed double blaze.
