Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 22 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS	
	N. 89° 43' W., bet. secs. 14 and 23. Descend 60 ft. over general W. slope, along the S. edge of logged area, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
2.60	Spring, 1 lk. wide, course S. 65° W.; desc. 30 ft. over W. slope.
5.50	Ravine, drains N.W.; asc. 15 ft. over N.E. slope.
7.50	Spur, slopes N. 80° W.; desc. 120 ft. over SW. slope.
19.93	Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 14 and 23. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.  <div style="text-align: center;"> <math display="block">\begin{array}{c} \text{W } 1/16 \quad \frac{\text{S } 14}{\text{S } 23} \\ 1963 \end{array}</math> </div> from which <div style="margin-left: 40px;"> A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 5½° E., 45 lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S14 BT.  A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 2° E., 91½ lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S 23 BT. </div> Enter logged area, edge bears generally S. and E.; desc. 80 ft. over SW. slope.
24.85	Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears N. 80° E. and S. 40° W.
26.10	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 30° W.; asc. 80 ft. over NE. slope.
29.20	Spring, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° E.; asc. 160 ft. over SE. slope.
37.70	Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. and S.; enter pasture land, edge bears N. and S.
39.86	The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23. The cor. is located on a ridge, bears N. and S.  Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, madrone, dogwood, alder ash, yew, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, ocean spray, Oregon grape, hazel, huckleberry, blackberry, salmonberry, poison oak, and fern.
	N. 4° 36' W., bet. secs. 14 and 15. Ascend 20 ft. over S. slope, across open pasture land.
4.00	Top of ascent, slopes SW.; enter logged area with scattering timber and dense undergrowth; desc. 140 ft. over NW. slope, changing to W. slope.
14.00	Bottom of descent, slopes W.; asc. 85 ft. along W. slope, changing to SW. slope.
33.00	Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 305 ft. over NE. slope.
