

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, 7th Stan. Par. S., N. Bdy. of T. 33 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

N. 89° 40' W., along the N. bdy. of sec. 2.

Descend 40 ft. over SW. slope.

4.25 Road, unimproved, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 25° W. and S. 25° E.

9.75 Dry bed of creek, 5 lks. wide, drains SW.; desc. 40 ft. along S. slope.

40.21 The Ives and Hyde standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 35, rehabilitated by Thiel in 1901, monumented with an iron pipe, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. from the ground, alongside of which is a yew post, 4 ins. sq., 36 ins. high, firmly set, mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S35 on the NW., SC on the NE., and CS on the SE. face, from which the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by Oscar F. Thiel in 1901.

A sawed Douglas fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 52° E., 71 lks. dist., mkd. T on a bark blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by the County Surveyor.

A Douglas fir, 27 ins. diam., bears N. 15° E., 109 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A Douglas fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 74° W., 174 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, directly over the iron pipe, with brass cap mkd.

An incense cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 43° E., 99 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S35 SC BT.

A Douglas fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 41° W., 74 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S35 SC BT.

Reset the wooden post alongside the iron post.

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the E. Bdy., T. 33 S., R. 5 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

(Restoring the 1894 survey by Edward F. Sharp and the 1897 retracement and survey by Winfield Chapman and Carl Nicklin)

From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, monumented with the original basalt stone, 12 x 8 x 6 ins., firmly set, 8 ins. in the ground, mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. face, from which the original bearing trees mkd. by Sharp:

A ponderosa pine, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 159 lks. dist., with a healed blaze. (Record, 165 lks.)
