GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are situated about 5 miles north of the small town of Glendale, Oregon. Access is gained by way of a gravelled road which extends northwesterly along Wood Creek, from Windy Creek Road.

The area is drained by Wood Creek, which flows Southeasterly into Windy Creek. Elevations range from about 1,600 feet above sea level at Wood Creek, on the line between sections 15 and 22, to about 3,050 feet above sea level on the ridge on the line between sections 10 and 15.

Soil in the area is composed generally of rocky clay loam. The timber consists primarily of fir, with stands of cedar, yellow pine, white fir, madrone, alder, and chinquapin; with an undergrowth of poison oak, vine maple, manzanita, arrowwood, hazel, blackberry, Oregon grape and salal.

No evidence of mineral deposits were noted int the area surveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 20° E. for the mean magnetic declination.
