Dependent Resurvey, Portion of E. Ddy., T. 29 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

- 26.80 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 35 ft. over SE. slope.
- 27.80 The SE. cor. of old growth timber, edge bears generally N. and W.; continue along W. edge of logged area.
- 35.50 Spur, slopes N. 65° E.; desc. 125 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.81 The cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1958, determined from two original bearing trees of which only one remains, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 12 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 17° E., 55 lks. dist., with scribe marks 29S R 8W S18 BT visible on open blaze. (Record, S. 12° E.)

A white fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 72° E., 29 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 62½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R9W S 13 CS BT visible on partly healed double blaze.

A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 34° W., 5½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S12 CS BT visible on partly healed double blaze.

Add marks BLM 1966 to brass cap.

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, sandy and rocky clay loam.  
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, alder, maple madrone, pine, and yew; undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, salal, hazel, ocean spray, blackberry, and huckleberry.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1958, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 8 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd.
