20.055	<p>N. 0° 25' E., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Descend 85 ft. over broken NE. slope.</p> <p>Point for the N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">N 1/16 S 11/S 12 1966</p> <p>from which</p> <p>A cedar, 10 ins. diam. bears N. 82° E., 29 lks. dist., mkd. 21.00	The NE. cor. of old growth timber, edges bear generally S. and W.; continue across logged area with scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

39.20	Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 50° W. and S. 50° E.
40.11	Point for the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
