

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 29 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. $53\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 68 lks.
dist., with scribe marks BT visible on partially
healed double blaze.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., $43\frac{1}{2}$ lks.
dist., with a healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, oak, dogwood, alder, and maple;
undergrowth, young timber, salal, dern, poison oak, vine
maple, huckleberry, hazel and salmonberry.

From the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, perpetuated and
recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor in 1962,
monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set,
extending 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A madrone, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 25° E.,
46 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible
on opened blaze. (Record, 45 lks.)

A fir snag, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 85° W.,
50 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 85° W., 47 lks.
dist., with partially opened blaze and with
illegible scribe marks visible on newer blaze.
(Record, 50 lks.)

and bearing trees marked by Byron

A pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 53 lks.
dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 22° E., $37\frac{1}{2}$ lks.
dist., with scribe marks T29S R3W S15 CS BT
visible on open blaze.

A myrtle, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 48° W., $16\frac{1}{2}$ lks.
dist., with scribe marks S16 CS BT visible on
open blaze.

Add marks HLM 1966 to brass cap.

N. $0^{\circ} 03'$ W., bet. secs. 9 and 10, marking and blazing
the true line.

Ascend 75 ft. over SW. slope, along the W. edge of
logged area, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

9.00 Ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 20° E.; desc. 85 ft. along
broken E. slope of ridge.

39.60 Ravine, drains E.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.

40.03 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 10, determined at record
bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:

A madrone, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 33 lks.
dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S visible on opened
blaze.
