

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 29 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

recorded by B. B. Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1941, again perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, extending 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

The stump hole of an uprooted madrone, 32 ins. diam., bears N.  $13\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 88 lks. dist., with a healed original blaze and mkd. with an X at breast height by Irving in 1941. (Record, N.  $15^{\circ}$  E.)

A fir root crown, size indeterminate, bears S.  $20^{\circ}$  E., 43 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.

The stump hole of an uprooted fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N.  $60^{\circ}$  W., 13 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.

and bearing trees mkd. by Irving in 1941

A cedar snag, 15 ins. diam., bears N.  $35^{\circ}$  E., 78 lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R3W S28 BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

The stump hole of an uprooted fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.  $21^{\circ}$  E., 90 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A sawed cedar stump, 35 ins. diam., bears S.  $63\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W., 26 lks. dist., bark scribed T29S R3W S32 BT.

The stump hole of an uprooted fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N.  $17^{\circ}$  W., 39 lks. dist., bark scribed T29S R3W S29 CS BT.

and bearing trees mkd. by Byron in 1962

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.  $40\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 103 lkd. dist., with a pitched over blaze.

A cedar, 26 ins. diam., bears S.  $28\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 42 lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R3W S33 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.  $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W.,  $63\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., with a healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, madrone, oak, maple, alder, ash, and pine; undergrowth, young timber, poison oak, salal, fern hazel, and Oregon grape.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33, and 34.

S.  $89^{\circ} 14'$  W., bet. secs. 28 and 33.

Descend 35 ft. over gradual W. slope, through scattering timber and moderate undergrowth.
