CHAINS

A yew, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $63\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 27 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T. I obliterate the marks on this
tree. (Old B.T.)

A cedar, 14 ins., bears S. $47\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 67 lks., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S36BT. (New BT)

Thence

S. $89^{\circ} 57'$ W., continuing measurements.

Asc. 115 ft. over rolling SE. slope.

47.21 Jackson Creek Trail, bears N, 70° E. and S. 70° W.

76.40 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 45 ft. over SW. slope.

80.37 The original cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, which is a
conglomerate stone, 12x12x8 ins., firmly set, mkd. with
1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edge. Hereafter this
cor. will refer to secs. 35 and 36 only.

At point for corner,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the
ground, with the original stone deposited at the base,
for the cor. of secs. 35 and 36 only, with brass cap
mkd.

mkd. T 30 S R 1 E S 1 B T. I obliterate the marks
on this tree. (Old B.T.)

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 20 lks. dist.,
mkd. T 30 S R 1 E S 2 B T. I obliterate the marks
on this tree. (Old B.T.)

A dead pine, 35 ins. diam., bears N. 56° W., 77 lks.
dist., mkd. T 29 S R 1 E S 35 B T. (Old B.T.)

A pine, 32 ins. diam., bears N. 43° E., 58 lks. dist.,
mkd. T 29 S R 1 E S 36 B T. (New B.T.)

A cedar, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 18° W., 109 lks. dist.
mkd. T 29 S R 1 E S 35 B T. (New B.T.)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay; 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, pine, yew, oak, ash, madrona, cedar, and
hemlock.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, serviceberry, 2nd growth, hazel,
spirea, willow, chinquapin, and alder,

N. $89^{\circ} 51'$ W., along S. bdy. of sec. 35.

Desc. 20 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.

2.40 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 30° E.; asc. 175 ft. over NE.
